



President Bush Recognizes Micron Technology for Helping Grow Economy Through Continued Investment

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Manassas, VA. , Tuesday, February 06, 2007 – President George W. Bush today visited Micron Technology's state-of-the-art fabrication facility here and told an employee audience that Micron is helping support the national economy through continued investment and job creation in states such as Virginia.

The recent \$3.5 billion upgrade of the Manassas plant to 300 millimeter capability has resulted in the creation of more than 1,000 new jobs at the site in the past year. Micron manufactures both DRAM memory and NAND flash memory at the facility.

"It's an honor for Micron to host President Bush at our Manassas site," said Appleton. "We believe in the innovation and ingenuity of the American workforce, and we continue to invest not only in Virginia, but also at our other U.S. locations."
