In the 1Q of FY 2011 (April 1, 2011 to June 30, 2011), the DRAM market experienced solid demand at the beginning of the quarter as customers built up inventory due to supply concerns related to the March 11 earthquake in northeastern Japan. Later, however, sluggish PC shipment volumes disrupted the balance of PC DRAM supply and demand, causing market prices to start declining in June.

Meanwhile, demand for mobile DRAM used in smartphones, tablet PCs and other mobile devices was lower than expected at the beginning of the quarter as a result of production adjustments among some mobile device makers and other factors. However, positive demand growth eventually resulted owing to market expansion.

Elpida's average selling price (ASP) in the 1Q was 9% lower against the previous quarter and down 57% compared with a year earlier. DRAM bit shipment growth in the quarter was 15% QoQ and 42% YoY.

As a result, net sales in the 1Q were 95.7 billion yen, up 3.9% QoQ and down 45.7% YoY. Gross profit, which finished at 12.6 billion yen, was up 5.3 billion yen QoQ due mainly to a higher fraction of 40nm process production and better yields. On a YoY basis, gross profit was down 49.1 billion yen, as the benefit of considerably lower manufacturing costs (made possible by continued process migration) was overcome by lower prices and yen appreciation effects.

An operating loss of 3.8 billion yen (versus a profit of 44.4 billion yen in 1Q-FY 2010) contained a QoQ improvement of 1.4 billion yen because of higher gross profit, but although SG&A expenses increased by 3.9 billion yen. An ordinary loss of 7.3 billion yen (versus a profit of 37.0 billion yen a year earlier) included interest expenses of 2.0 billion yen. The quarter finished with a net loss of 7.9 billion yen (versus a profit of 30.7 billion yen a year earlier).

(2) Financial Conditions

(i) Assets, Liabilities and Shareholders' Equity

Elpida's total assets as the end of the 1Q were 849.9 billion yen, down 29.1 billion yen compared to the end of FY 2010. Key factors were an increase in inventory but a lower cash and deposits and a lower tangible assets due to depreciation.

Scheduled debt repayment and payment of lease obligations brought down the balance of interest-bearing debt to 399.3 billion yen, a reduction of 5.7 billion yen against the end of FY 2010.

Net assets at the end of the 1Q were 347.1 billion yen, down 8.9 billion yen versus the end of FY 2010. The main factor was lower retained earnings that resulted from the recording of a quarterly net loss.

(ii) Cash Flows

As of the end of the 1Q-FY 2011 the balance of cash and cash equivalents was 84.7 billion yen, down 28.1 billion yen versus the end of the FY 2010.

Operating activities saw a net cash inflow of 7.4 billion yen, a decrease of 57.4 billion yen versus 1Q-FY2010. Key factors were a 7.3 billion yen loss before income taxes and a 14.4 billion yen increase in inventories while accounts receivable-trade saw a decrease of 6.2 billion yen.

Investing activities used net cash of 30.7 billion yen, an increase of 1.4 billion yen from the amount used a year earlier. The main factor was a 26.1 billion yen outflow for the purchase of property, plant and equipment, an increase of 8.6 billion yen versus 1Q-FY2010.

Financing activities saw a net cash outflow of 4.5 billion yen, a 10.0 billion yen decrease from an inflow of 5.5 billion yen posted a year earlier. Proceeds from long-term loans payable brought in 5.6 billion yen, but on the other side were the disappearances of proceeds from last year's 11.6 billion yen issuance of common stock and 6.8 billion issuance of convertible bond-type bonds with subscription rights to shares, among other factors.

(3) 2Q of FY 2011 and Full-Term Outlook

An imbalance in supply and demand in the PC DRAM market can result in extreme price volatility. Also, a precise forecast of future PC DRAM prices is quite difficult. Since extreme price volatility can strongly affect business results, Elpida is not presenting earnings forecasts. Instead, as shown below, the company is presenting several estimates relevant to the 2Q and full term of FY 2011 that can be used as a general guideline.

1. Reduction in capital reserve

The Company resolved at the general shareholders' meeting held on June 28, 2011 to reduce capital reserve and it became effective on July 11, 2011.

(1) Purpose

Depending upon the investment agreement with DBJ made on August 7, 2009 regarding the issuance of preferred shares by way of third party allotment, the Company granted to the allotted party the right to request acquisitions of the preferred shares with cash consideration. Under this situation, the Company must secure the distributable amount stipulated in Article 461, Section 2 of the Corporation Law of Japan enough to acquire the preferred shares in case the right is exercised by the allotted party.

(2) Method of reduction in capital reserve and its amount

The Company reduced capital reserve of \$60,000 million out of total capital reserve and reduced capital reserve was transferred to other capital surplus.
